2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.

SBS has taken the following measures to complete the syllabus of courses and programs. To timely complete, the syllabus of all courses, proper planning is required. The curriculum is prepared by the concerned specialization Board of Studies (BOS) consisting of experts from the industry, academia, and alumni. The curriculum is finally approved by the Academic Council. At the beginning of each academic year, the academic calendar and guidelines about the dates of commencement of the semester, end of the semester, continuous evaluation, semester-end examinations, practical examinations, holidays, etc. will be issued. The Director receives inputs from IQAC, the placements cell head, the admission head, and the academic head and discusses and prepares the institute's Academic and Event Calendar.

SBS follows an academic calendar detailed enough to cover the available time frame yet flexible enough to permit changes. Faculty members take utmost care to complete the syllabus on time. For the First Year, the course allotment is done in Faculty Council meetings where the faculty members volunteer to teach subjects based on their interests. In case, more than one faculty opt for a subject, the Director takes the final decision. Course allocation of the second year is done by the Area Chairs of each specialization in consultation with the faculty members of their respective specializations. The teaching plan - schedule of instruction of each course is prepared in line with the academic calendar by individual course faculty. The planning and implementation of the curriculum are monitored by the Dean and the Director

The Dean and Director monitor the progress of syllabus coverage every fortnight through. The number of lectures planned, and the number of lectures conducted help in the identification of gaps if any, and necessary corrective actions are taken for filling the gap. Periodic meetings of IQAC take stock of the progress of teaching-learning.

The following activities related to academic planning and monitoring are carried out:

- Preparation of Weekly Schedule
- Developing measurable learning outcomes
- Aligning the courses to learning outcomes
- Preparation of a detailed Session Plan with clearly defined objectives, outcomes, prerequisites, etc. (Teaching Plan).
- Encouraging pre-reading and post-reading habits in students.
- Determine ways to include technology to promote learning
- Attendance Monitoring: (Course-wise, Class-wise, Percentage-wise).
- Displaying defaulters' lists and preparing schedules for make-up classes.
- Record of make-up classes.
- Individual mentoring of students
- Monitoring of syllabus coverage.
- IQAC Executes Academic Audit for each academic year.
- Monitoring of Continuous Evaluations.
- Upload assignments, a question bank, e-learning/Early Learning content, video lectures, lecture notes, PowerPoint presentations, and class handouts.
- Students feedback – mid-semester, end of the semester
- Course Exit Survey for OBE.
- Special lectures delivered by eminent scholars as part of the Guest lecture series. Forex: the "Thought Leaders' Speak Series' on topics related to the curriculum further intensifies students' learning experience.
